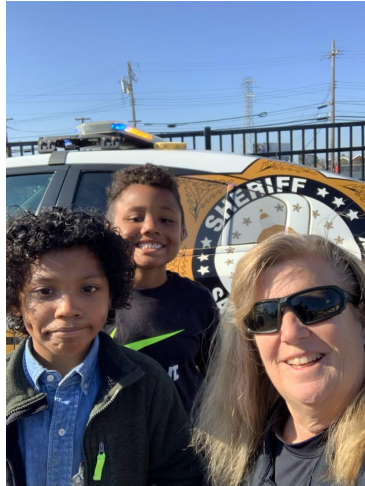

Indoor Soccer



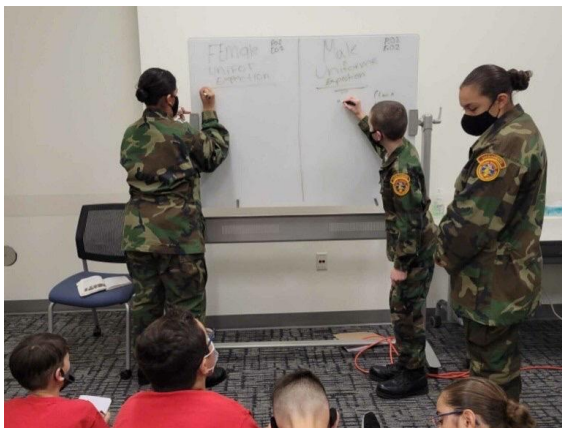
