


LUNCHTIME WITH YSU

The S.H.O.C.K. program takes on a leadership role by partnering with community-based organizations, local businesses, and other youth-serving agencies to reach out to those youth considered at-


risk for making poor choices in their lives.

Chronic absenteeism, continuous disruption to classroom learning, signs of experimentation with drugs and/or alcohol, as well as involvement with the gang lifestyle are considered behaviors that could lead to devastating life-long consequences.

This program is designed to:

- Redirect negative behavior
- Provide partnerships with law enforcement, the community, and schools
- Increase understanding of the criminal justice system
- Emphasize the legal consequences of violating the law
